

ORDINANCE NUMBER 74

AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY AND TO INCORPORATE SAME WITHIN THE CORPORATE BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWN OF MOUNT CARMEL, TENNESSEE.

WHEREAS, a public hearing before this body was held on the Tenth day of April, 1980, pursuant to a resolution adopted on March 13, 1980 and notice thereof published in the Post-News on March 22, 1980; and,

WHEREAS, It now appears that the prosperity of this town and of the territory herein described will be materially retarded and the safety and welfare of the inhabitants and property thereof endangered if such territory is not annexed; and,

WHEREAS, the annexation of such territory is deemed necessary for the welfare of the residents and property owners thereof and of this town as a whole, and

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It ordained by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the town of Mount Carmel, Tennessee:

Section 1. Pursuant to authority conferred by sections 6-308 to 6-320, Tennessee Code Annotated, there is hereby annexed to the town of Mount Carmel, Tennessee, and incorporated within the corporate boundaries thereof, the following described territory adjoining the present corporate boundaries:

Embracing that certain part of civil district no. 7 of Hawkins County, Tennessee, and more fully described to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point, said point being in the easterly corporate boundary of Mount Carmel, and also being approximately 350 feet northerly of the northern right-of-way of Ross Campground Road; thence from said point due north for approximately 3,000 feet to a point, said point being the intersection of the easterly corporate boundary of Mount Carmel with Sensabaugh Branch; thence from said point in an easterly and southerly direction following the corporate boundary of Mount Carmel for a distance of approximately 7,000 feet to a point, said point being the point of BEGINNING.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective from and after it's passage, the public welfare requiring it.
