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### **Purchases with Other Local Governments**

Reference Number: MTAS-721

#### **Purchases from Other Governments**

Any municipality may buy second-hand items or equipment or other materials, supplies, commodities, and equipment from any other government. These purchases may be made without competitive bidding and public advertisement, regardless of charter requirements. T.C.A. § 12-3-1003.

#### **Purchases for Other Local Governments**

A local governmental entity may buy supplies, equipment and services for any other local governmental body. Examples of governmental entities include municipalities, counties and utility districts.

The acquisition must be made on the terms of the entity making the purchase. Obviously, the cost will be borne by the entity for which the purchase was made.

All competitive bidding and public advertisement requirements of the requesting entity are met if the purchasing body complies with its own buying requirements. In the bid, it's a good idea for the purchasing entity to identify the requesting entity, especially when services, not supplies and equipment, are being bought. T.C.A. § 12-3-1004.

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
